

Diabetes Management Procedure

This procedure should be read in conjunction with the 'Medical Conditions and Medication Policy'.

As diabetes is a medical condition that requires specific management strategies, further procedures have been developed and outlined below, to be followed in conjunction with existing Medical Management Procedures.

Supporting Children with Diabetes

- 1. When a child with diabetes enrols at the service, a meeting will be conducted with the parent to discuss:
 - a. the Medical Management Plan and any special requirements needed
 - b. the child's level of independence in regard to the management of their medical condition and;
 - c. to prepare the child's Risk Minimisation Plan.
- 2. Appropriate training will be given to relevant educators, to ensure that they are able to provide the level of care and assistance required to manage this condition.
- 3. The centre will keep a supply of lollies or sweet drinks for the purposes of treating hypoglycaemic episodes.
- 4. All Educators will be informed of this child and details about the condition as to monitor the child's wellbeing while at the service.

Managing Blood-Glucose Levels

- 1. During the management of this condition, the child will report to staff when checking their blood-glucose levels:
 - a. If assistance is needed staff will use relevant PPE.
 - b. Where staff are required to assist in the use of sharps, staff will be trained in how to do so correctly and safely.
- 2. Test results will be recorded in the child's logbook and acted upon according to the details shown on the Medical Management Plan.
- 3. If the administration of insulin is required, staff will:
 - a. Complete a medication administration record for any insulin given via a syringe or insulin pen, or;
 - b. Supervise the entering of information into the child's insulin pump
